

Direct Object Pronouns (DOPs)

* The direct object of a sentence answers the question

"What?"

i.e. "I bought the sweater."

I bought WHAT? - the sweater (DO)

*The DOP replaces the DO so you don't have to repeat it.

i.e. "I loved that sweater! I bought it. (DOP)"

Direct Object Pronouns = DOPs:

me - me

nos - us

te - you

os - y'all

lo - him, it (m)

los - them (m), you all

la - her, it (f)

las - them (f), you all (f)

*The DOP goes RIGHT BEFORE the conjugated verb...
Yo compré el suéter.

Yo lo compré. (I bought it.)

The DOP can also be attached to the end of an infinitive....

Sarah va a leer un libro

a. Sarah va a leerlo

b. Sarah lo va a leer.
