◆ Accreditation/Certifications

Irmo High School International School for the Arts is accredited by the South Carolina Department of Education, Cognia and College Board and has been designated a National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education three times. Irmo High School International School for the Arts is a certified International Baccalaureate World School and a certified magnet school through Magnet Schools of America.

◆ Magnet School: Student Population 1,300

Irmo High School International School for the Arts is a four-year comprehensive public school serving grades 9-12. Curriculum areas offered include International Baccalaureate, Advanced Placement, dual credit, honors, college preparatory, career and technical preparatory, and special education programs. Offering a well-rounded Global Education, our magnet programs include This Is Escolares for gifted 9th and 10th graders; the International Baccalaureate Diploma and Career Certificate for visionary 11th and 12th graders; and an all-school Arts Integration approach to learning. All students in School District Five are eligible to attend these programs regardless of attendance zones.

◆ School District Five: Student Population 17,000

◆ Explanation of Transcript

School Calendar

Irmo High School International School for the Arts' year consists of four quarters of approximately nine weeks' duration. Classes meet for 18 weeks (one semester) or 36 weeks (two semesters) on an alternating A/B block schedule of 90 minute class periods, four periods per day. One (1) unit of credit represents two semesters' work; one-half (1/2) unit represents one semester's work.

Course Placement

Placement in each subject depends on student achievement, standardized test scores, and teacher recommendation. Students are not tracked into any one program or level.

Grade Point Ratio

A uniform grading policy has been implemented for all students in South Carolina high schools effective 2016-2017. This new computation system, the Grade Point Ratio (GPR), has replaced the previous Grade Point Average (GPA) method. The GPR is calculated by assigning a weight to each numerical grade on all courses carrying credits. An additional .5 is assigned for Honors courses and an additional 1.0 is assigned for Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate (SL1,SL,HL), and Dual Credit courses. To calculate GPR, the sum of the weights of each grade is divided by the number of units attempted.

Class Rank

In each class, the students' Grade Point Ratio (GPR) is ranked from highest to lowest.

◆ **Block Scheduling**

Irmo High School International School for the Arts' students enjoy an environment of enhanced study through the use of alternating day (A/B) block scheduling. With block scheduling, students:

- Have more in-depth study and interact more personally with teachers due to longer class periods.
- May take eight courses per year earning 32 credits during 4 years rather than the traditional 20-24 credits.
- Take college courses while in high school.

◆ **Graduation Requirements**

To meet South Carolina graduating requirements, students must earn a minimum of 24 Carnegie units and demonstrate computer proficiency. The State Department of Education specifies that credits must be distributed as follows:
